## Classroom Expectations-POTTERY 3

<u>Course Description:</u> This course is a continuation of Pottery 2. Students delve deeper into technical skills such as clay management, clay construction, tools, equipment, glaze application, wheel-throwing, and firing techniques. Expressive skills will be extended through the creation of original works, choice of themed projects, and a formal student portfolio. Students will also get the opportunity to continue to learn about the electric potter's wheel and gain experience in wheel-throwing.

## Materials needed for class:

- Folder
- Notebook or lined paper for note taking
- · Pencils and eraser
- Shoe box to store projects in
- Hardcover novel to reuse and recycle into sketchbook (check thrift stores or dollar store)

<u>Lab fee:</u> It is time again to ask for your help and support. This year's lab fee will be **\$35.00**. Lab fees help pay for a year's worth of clay, glaze, and other miscellaneous materials.

Lab fees can be paid online, or cash may be turned in to Mrs. Abney in a sealed envelope. Write the student's name and class period on the outside of this envelope. **LAB FEES ARE DUE AT THE END OF THE FIRST 9 WEEKS!** 

Other helpful materials for class that can be found around the house are: plastic containers with lids, old towels, and plastic shopping bags. Thank you!

Classroom rules: To have a safe and effective learning environment, students are asked to follow these rules.

- 1. Respect others and their property at all times
- 2. Respect the teacher's right to teach and the students' right to learn
- 3. Candy, food, and drinks are not allowed in the art room
- 4. Be in your assigned seat, working when the bell rings
- 5. All rules in the student handbook will be enforced

<u>Consequences:</u> If inappropriate behavior occurs or a student chooses to break a classroom rule, the student will receive a warning, a referral, or a conference with the parents will be scheduled.

<u>Rewards:</u> Appropriate behavior is not only appreciated, but also expected from high school students. If the class is being productive and following classroom rules they will be rewarded in the following ways:

- Music in the classroom during work time
- · Positive notes or emails sent home
- Select own seat for the day

<u>Tardies:</u> Each student is expected to arrive on time to class. Repeated tardies will result in disciplinary actions as per the student handbook rules.

**Grading:** Students will be graded on the following items:

- Clay Projects
- · Weekly Journal assignments
- Project Reflection Packets
- Homework assignments
- Participation/Behavior grade
- Tests
- Critiques
- Online Portfolio

<u>Projects</u>: Projects will typically be graded out of 100 points and based on the rubric provided at the onset of the assignment. After the teacher's demonstration, students will have several days/weeks in and out of class to complete projects, and will be well aware of the project's due date and critique date.

<u>Homework:</u> Homework will be issued frequently and may include working on or completing a project at home, research, reading, sketching, and other assignments. Sketchbook/Journal assignments will be issued weekly. Homework assignments will be graded based upon completion and effort put forth. All homework assignments are due the following class period unless otherwise stated. One day of makeup is allowed for each excused absence.

<u>Participation/Behavior grade</u>: Each student will earn a monthly participation/behavior grade depending on his or her work ethic, participation, cooperation, attitude, and behavior. This grade will be posted at the end of each month and is worth 100 points.

<u>Tests:</u> Written tests will be issued concerning vocabulary terms, definitions, techniques, and art history. Students will be aware of the test's date, as well as what topics to study.

<u>Critiques:</u> Students will be graded on their written and/or verbal critiques of a project through a series of prompts provided by the teacher.

<u>Portfolio:</u> Advanced students are encouraged and expected to keep a digital and online portfolio, illustrating progression of artwork, final completed pieces, an artist statement, influential artwork of others, etc. Online portfolios will be checked upon completion of projects through the use of a rubric and checklist. Students may be asked to publish website and share with other students in the class. **Online portfolios are to be used for educational purposes only. Students will not advertise or attempt to sell their artwork, nor post another's artwork without a resource provided or consent from the artist.** 

\*If the student begins to fall behind, or simply desires to work extra, he or she may come into the art room before school or after school (after school arrangements must be made with the teacher prior to that given work day). Art students are strongly encouraged to utilize the extra time provided by the teacher to stay on schedule.

\*NO grades will be rounded up at the conclusion of each quarter. You will receive the exact grade you have EARNED!

**Extra Credit:** Students have the ability to earn extra credit points in class for participation, winning an art game or contest, and answering extra credit test questions correctly. Students may also bring in the following item for 10 extra credit points on an assignment. (10 points maximum).

- Box of tissues
- Hand soap
- Hand sanitizer
- Bottle of cleaning spray

This will help students' grades and allows us to have these items in the classroom for everyone to use. Please turn in supplies with your name and class period visible on items to be sure you receive credit!
